To recognise and use the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction and use this to check calculations and missing number problems. <p>Multiplication and Division</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables, including recognising odd and even numbers. - Calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division and write them using the multiplication (x), division (÷) and equals (=) sign. - Solve problems involving multiplication and division. - Show that the multiplication of two numbers can be done in any order and division cannot. 	<p>This term our theme in class is: <i>Great Fire of London</i></p> <p>Within this theme we will be covering the following subjects:</p> <p>History - Looking at the events of the fire, exploring houses from Tudor times and looking at eyewitness accounts of the fire.</p> <p>Geography- Looking at, and identifying London on a map of Britain and also locating the different countries within Great Britain.</p> <p>Art- Creating 2D collages of the fire and drawing different pictures of St Pauls with different media.</p> <p>DT- Creating 3D models of Tudor homes. Making and decorating a model cathedral using clay.
